

The following code of conduct has been adopted for the use of Rotarians:

1. Act with integrity and high ethical standards in my personal and professional life
2. Deal fairly with others and treat them and their occupations with respect
3. Use my professional skills through Rotary to: mentor young people, help those with special needs, and improve people's quality of life in my community and in the world
4. Avoid behavior that reflects adversely on Rotary or other Rotarians
5. Help maintain a harassment-free environment in Rotary meetings, events, and activities, report any suspected harassment, and help ensure non-retaliation to those individuals that report harassment.

[Keith Blackey](#) joined us again from the Rotary Club of Kabul, Afghanistan. He visited our club on 3/28/22. After retiring from a career in the Silicon Valley, he spent 10 years in Kabul establishing the Girl and Boy Scout organizations which now have over 10,000 members. Before that, he lived 6 years in Iraq, also establishing the Girl and Boy Scout organizations which now have over 150,000 members. Unfortunately, the situation is currently untenable in Kabul and he left when the Taliban took over. His wife is also now retired from the Silicon Valley and they are now living in Las Vegas. He said there are more refugees coming from Afghanistan than are coming from anywhere else. He said the Kabul club had 200 members, half local and half ex-pats, etc. He said about a third of the club were women. PROGRAM

Don Logan, President/COO, of the [Las Vegas Aviators](#), was our speaker today. He continues the long line of fascinating speakers at our club. He was introduced by **Bruce Pope** who has known him for years...since the days that the team needed someone to donate some scissor lifts for the team's cameras over the outfield fences. **Bruce**, then at Hertz, stepped up. Interesting side note, **Clinton Pope** was a batboy for the team during the 1993 season.

Don brought along some complimentary orange team hats and is also going to donate something for our Gold Raffle. Click [here](#) for the Aviator's schedule.



He spoke a lot about the Oakland A's and the possibility of that team moving to Las Vegas. He said they have been talking about it since 2004. He said the owner of the A's, John Fisher, is very interested in Vegas, including the possibility of being a casino owner. (Factoid...John Fisher is the son of the two brothers that started the Gap stores.)

He talked about the possible locations of a Major League ball park in Las Vegas and said there are still 5 being discussed (my notes fail me here, but I think they are (1) by the Rio, (2) City View-100 acres, (3) behind Paris/Bally's, (4) Wild West on Trop and Dean Martin, and (5) the Tropicana Hotel location although that location would be difficult for a lot of reasons, not the least of which is traffic and the fact that there may be a lot of asbestos in the Trop that would require a tremendous amount of expensive mitigation. He also said there may be some consideration for the property at the Strip and Sahara.

The test to see whether you have read this far is to answer the following question; "What does Don's name have to do with his collegiate alma mater?" I'm sure **Pres. Jordana** will give a hefty credit to the first person to correctly answer the question.

Don's background is impressive. Here is some more information about him.

He is in his 39th season with the Las Vegas professional baseball franchise. He possesses a vast background and knowledge of both the game of baseball and the Las Vegas sports scene, and has been a part of Las Vegas' two Pacific Coast League championship teams (1986, 1988).

A native of Tonopah, Nevada, Logan began his career with the franchise as an account executive in 1984 and quickly moved up the front-office ladder. He became ticket manager in 1985, and a year later was promoted to assistant general manager. He held that position for the next four seasons before taking over as general manager in 1991. On January 3, 2000, Logan added the title of president to his responsibilities as general manager and remained in that role until June 3, 2013, when he was named President/COO of The Summerlin Las Vegas Baseball Club LLC.

During his tenure, Logan has earned respect not only as one of the most influential sports executives in Las Vegas, but in all of professional baseball. That respect has been recognized with countless honors, most notably as the first and only three-time winner of the Pacific Coast League's Executive of the Year award (1992, 1998, 2018). Logan is also a two-time recipient of the Larry McPhail Promotional Trophy (1991, 1997), and in December 2019, he was named *Baseball America* Minor League Executive of the Year. He has also served as the PCL's Vice President and on the Joint Minor League Baseball Marketing Committee. As a one-time chairman of the PCL's Executive Committee, Logan oversaw league operations and later served on the advisory board of PCL President Branch Rickey III. The Aviators franchise, on December 2, 2021, was the recipient of the *Baseball America* Triple-A Bob Freitas Award. The Freitas award is given annually to the organization of the year at each level of the Minor Leagues.

Under Logan's guidance and in partnership with the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority (LVCVA), the Las Vegas franchise has hosted dozens of Major League Baseball spring training games at Cashman Field and Las Vegas Ballpark. These "Big League Weekend" games have featured such Hall of Fame players as Las Vegas native Greg Maddux, Ken Griffey, Jr. and the late Tony Gwynn, as well as perennial All-Stars Barry Bonds, Alex Rodriguez, Ichiro Suzuki, Sandy Alomar Jr. and Matt Kemp, to name a few. In part because of Big League Weekend's success, the Oakland A's elected to play their first six games of the 1996 season at Cashman Field, while their home stadium (the Oakland Alameda County Coliseum) was completing renovations.

Logan also was instrumental in bringing the Triple-A World Series to Cashman Field for three years (1998-2000), pitting the PCL champion against International League champion. Logan then worked with the MLB Players Association to host the "Big League Home Run Challenge " at Cashman Field. The nationally televised event (ESPN, ESPN2) took place each February from 2000-03.


Despite a busy schedule, Logan has found time to support many community projects, including serving on the Executive Committee of both the Las Vegas Bowl and Southern Nevada Sports Hall of Fame. Among the honors he's received for his community work include : the 2007 Chin's Humanitarian of the Year for the Muscular Dystrophy Association of Southern Nevada; 2010 ESPN Sportsman of the Year, benefitting The Caring Place, a local nonprofit dedicated to easing the journey of those affected by cancer ; 2018 Nevada Broadcasters Association and Foundation Community Achievement Award; and 2018 Free Enterprise Award presented by the Las Vegas Metro Chamber of Commerce to those who personify the entrepreneurial spirit and commitment to free enterprise in Southern Nevada and across the entire state.


In conjunction with the Howard Hughes Corporation, Logan in October 2017 secured a naming-rights deal with the LVCVA for Las Vegas Ballpark, a new state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin. After working for two decades to make the stadium a reality, Logan finally ushered in a new era for professional baseball in Southern Nevada when Las Vegas Ballpark broke ground February 23, 2018. The venue officially opened its doors April 9, 2019, welcoming a sellout crowd of 11,036, and the Aviators would go on to lead all of Minor League Baseball in attendance in 2019.

A 1981 graduate of Utah State and 2011 inductee into the Southern Nevada Sports Hall of Fame, Logan has been married to his wife, Jennifer, for 23 years. He has one daughter, Adrienne.




