SPEAKER

Today’s program was presented by the “Past Presidents” in attendance:

Gib Oswald (president 1975-1976 and represented by his daughter, Southwest Rotarian **Lori Clarke**) send a nice letter that was read by **Lori**. He is 87 years old now and said he is buried in snow in Wyoming. He said he was the youngest (24) ever to join the club which was then known as an “old man’s club”. He had 40 years perfect attendance and went to 4 Rotary International conferences, on one of which he was accompanied by **Lori**.

Jack Woodcock joined in 1976 and became president in 1982 and joined because of Southwest Rotarians **Gib Oswald** and **Bill Hartman**, both of whom were fellow Toastmasters. **Jack** said his debunking will go down in history for a number of reasons, one of which was that his wrestling prowess was put on exhibition at his debunking...descriptions of his opponent and details of the wrestling match will be left to the imagination.

Vern Ratzlaff, 1983-1984, was introduced to the club by **Dr. Bob Taylor** (president 1976-1977) and even though he no longer lives in the area, still comes back every year to help our club with our Gold Raffle. He is an auctioneer extraordinaire.

Steve Van Meetren, 1987-1988, commented about the previous debunkings and mentioned his fond associations with members that joined around the same time as he did. Our club members will remember the recent presentation (10/22) from Roseman University when we had the pleasure of having **Vicky VanMeetren**, Steve’s better half, in attendance as a guest of the speaker that day.

Chris Publow, 1991-1992, said he was also introduced to the club by **Bill Hartman**, a fellow classmate from Western High School, and joined in 1982. He spoke somewhat wistfully of one of the board retreats where they were escorted off the casino premises, due to some apparently excessive celebrations (libations??)

Tom Martin, 1995-1996, spoke about reviving Greenspokes on his watch, along with making a donation to the Las Vegas Rescue Mission as a speaker recognition instead of the small gifts previously provided.

Joanne Blystone, joined in 1989 as the first female member of the Southwest Rotary Club and in 1996 became the first female president. She said she was at the retreat when certain Rotarians were “86’d” from the casino. She diplomatically provided no names.

Ed Jamison, 2001-2002, spoke about the great time he had attending the International Convention in Barcelona Spain and said it is a great way to learn about Rotary and see what is being done around the world.

Keith Thomas, 2003-2004, reiterated the importance of attending the International Convention and said that he went to the conference in Brisbane, Australia. He also talked about the Rotary Centennial project which involved the remodeling of the kitchen at the Blind Center of Las Vegas.

Adrienne Cox, 2004-2005, joined today via Zoom but was disconnected prior to her being able to make her presentation. Suffice it to say that she was an awesome president and although she no longer is a member, continues to participate on the scholarship committee and in club service projects (including next week’s water filter project in Puerto Vallarta).

Eric Colvin, 2006-2007, said that he participated in many Rotary projects with his dad prior to joining Rotary himself. He said he liked to help with the fund-raising projects and talked about the football pool that he runs each year. He said that this year we have made over \$11,000 to support the Las Vegas Southwest Rotary Club’s Vocational Services which includes Scholarships, RYLA, TLC, 4 Way Speech Contest, Dan Stover Music Contest and much more.

Melissa Copeland, 2010-2011, used to work with former Rotarian (RIP) **Jimmy Pettyjohn** (president 1997-1998), and participated in lots of projects prior to joining Rotary. She said that not long after her year as president, she moved away, acquired a new husband, and moved back and rejoined Rotary.

Aric Graham, 2011-2012, said that he attended the RI International Convention in Bangkok, Thailand and had a great year as president.

Troy Lockhead, 2013-2014, was introduced to Rotary by former Southwest Rotarian **Robbie Graham** (president 1999-2000) with whom she was working at the time. She said she was most proud of our scholarship program and told about one of our scholarship winners who was homeless and eventually graduated with a 4.4 GPA and said that she wouldn’t have been able to finish college without our scholarship.

Ron Reynolds, 2017-2018, said he joined in 1976 when the club was meeting at the Charleston Bowl (which became Arizona Charlie's) and then moved to the Bingo Palace (which became Palace Station) and then moved to the Port Tack (which closed for remodeling and never reopened) and then moved to Chin's and then the Elk's Lodge, and finally to Lawry's. He said our club has become much more reserved over the years, describing how one speaker began disrobing midway through her presentation. He also mentioned the tree project our club had undertaken at the request of the RI President. He said when he joined, he was representing a lot of companies, like the RJ, YESCO, etc. He said one of his clients was **Gib Oswald**, at Westgate Drug who was having a problem getting a sign approved. **Ron** represented him and was able to get the sign approved. Karl Maisner, 2018-2019, said he was introduced to Rotary by a local architect, Dave Wells. Apparently, after attending a meeting and then not showing up again, **Adrienne Cox** and **Tom Martin** showed up at his office and escorted him to lunch and the rest is history.

Sean Tanko, 2019-2020, called during the meeting and said he was in the parking lot but apparently he got caught up in a business call or something as he never made it inside.

Jordana Lane, 2020-2021 AND 2021-2022, holds the distinction of the only president who has served two consecutive years. She said she came to Las Vegas from Northern California where she was involved with the American Cancer Society and other charity projects. When she came here, **Francesca Gilbert**, with whom she worked at the time, suggested she join Rotary. She did and the rest is history.

We concluded with the 4-Way Test.

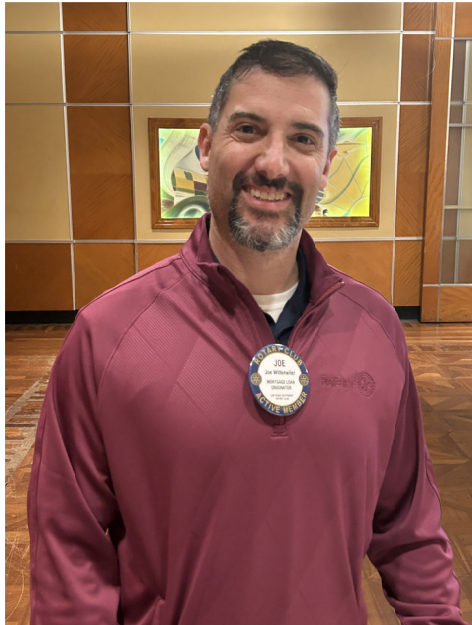
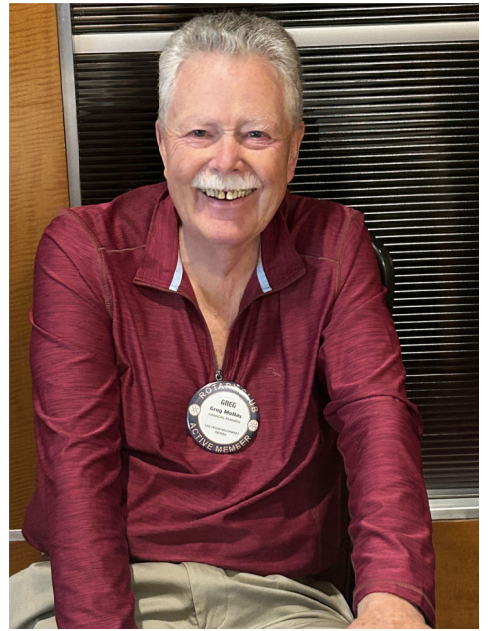


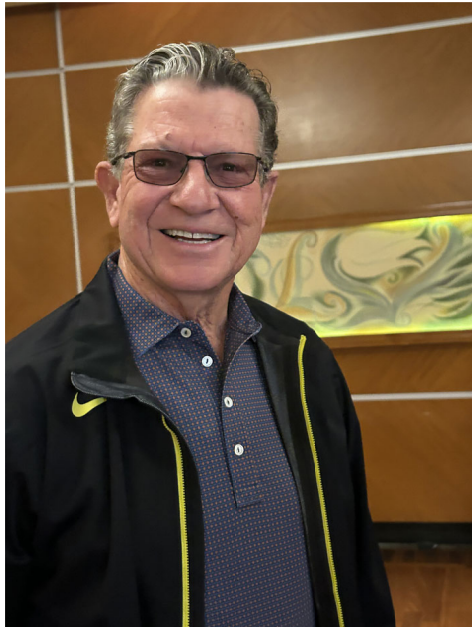

Project: Plant 75 Petite 5 gallon Moapa Ash Trees near a natural spring within tender soil.

Benefactor: Warm Springs Nature Area/Preserve - Conservation Water and Endangered Species.

Project Scope: I am looking for volunteers to assist with Planting Trees, installing weed barriers (carpet squares) and tree cages (animal barrier).
