A diagnosis of childhood cancer is devastating for the family. Childhood cancer is treated aggressively, often with a combination of chemotherapy, radiation, and surgery, at a time of life when bodies are growing and developing. Treatment has a significant long-term impact on children's' endocrine, heart, and cognitive functions. Additionally, parents of children with cancer are often young, have a limited income, and they have other children. One parent often needs to give up a job to take care of their child being treated for cancer.

The needs are great, and Candlelighters Childhood Cancer Foundation is a primary provider of essential programs and services required by families of children with cancer.

Families whose children are diagnosed with cancer, who have financial constraints and are in need of these valuable resources are encouraged to contact Candlelighters. Several informative books are available to families in need without charge.

The Candlelighters Childhood Cancer Foundation National Office was founded in 1970 by concerned parents of children with cancer. Today the membership of over 43,000 includes:

- Parents of children who are being treated or have been treated for cancer
- Children with cancer and Survivors of childhood cancer
- Immediate or extended family members
- Bereaved families
- Health care professionals and Educators
  - •Each day, 46 children are diagnosed with cancer
  - •One in 330 children will develop cancer by age 20
  - •Although cure rates are steadily increasing, 35% of children will die
  - •Cancer remains the number one disease killer of children; more than genetic anomalies, cystic fibrosis, and AIDS combined



Mike: (No way I'd do that..."you know who" is bigger than I am...)


