PROGRAM


Akita McCulloch, Community Engagement Coordinator for the <u>Clark County School District</u> was our speaker today. She filled us in on the CCSD's mentoring project (see flyer attached).

The <u>Stay in School Mentoring Project</u> matches volunteers from the community across a broad spectrum of professions with students that need guidance and support to help them be successful in school. Mentors meet with their matched CCSD student throughout the year to provide positive guidance, support, and encouragement.

She said that the program began initially only for the Title 1 schools but has since been expanded to all schools in the district. Superintendent Jara wants to have 1000 mentors by 2024. She said they are still 252 away from their goal.

She said it is not about tutoring, but about goal setting and helping support the student to meet their goals. The mentors meet with their student twice a month during the school day at the school.


