


PROGRAM

Veterans' Voices: We're Listening [VVWL] is an oral history collaborative at UNLV in association with the <u>Women's Research Institute of Nevada and the Military and Veteran Services Center.</u>

She founded the project in 2022 to capture the experiences of Southern Nevada Veterans and their families. *Veterans' Voices: We're Listening* represents all branches and eras of the U.S. military and documents the diversity of Veterans and their experiences, their service, and sacrifices.

The audio-recorded oral histories of Veterans and their families are transcribed and edited. They also scan photographs and other materials that will be included in the final oral history. They then create and publish a book of the

OUR VETERANS

Southern Nevada has an estimated population of 160, 000 Veterans, from periods as early as WWII through to the Global War on Terror. We interview Veterans of many backgrounds, identities, and experiences – men and women, combat and noncombat, enlisted and officer, draftees, and volunteers – who share how service shaped their lives.

We provide a safe, empathetic space for them to tell their own story and shed light on what it truly means to be a Veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces.

ABOUT US

Until this project, no organized place existed to interview and preserve the experiences of southern Nevada Veterans. When local oral historian Barbara Tabach learned of this, she took it as a challenge and founded **Veterans' Voices: We're Listening**. For over a decade, Barbara's career as an oral historian flourished at UNLV's Oral History Research Center where she collected over 400 oral histories to preserve Las Vegas history.

In 2022, Barbara forged a collaboration with two successful centers at UNLV: the Women's Research Institute of Nevada and the Military & Veteran Services Center. The Eleanor Kagi Foundation partnered with VVWL and the organized collecting began.

Using her expertise, Barbara brought together a team to establish a collection of interviews and photographs that will be archived for access by researchers.

OUR PROCESS

The honor of listening to our local Veterans is priceless. Our VVWL team produces the oral history at no cost to the Veteran or their family. During a series of oral history interviews, we guide Veterans to recall their life and military experiences. We spend hours audiorecording interviews with each Veteran, learning about their background, their entry into the military, their experiences, and their transition after the military. Each participating Veteran then has an opportunity to review and edit their transcripts. As a bonus, we encourage Veterans to share photos and collateral materials that we scan and include in their archival collection. VVWL then creates a personal book for each narrator.








Veterans' Voices: We're Listening Oral History Workflow

An oral historian from the project schedules an interview with the narrator. At the interview, they collect a signed consent form and audio record the interview. Typical interviews last two hours.

We typically schedule at least one follow up session to capture more details about the narrators' lives and military experiences. We also scan photos and other documents from them.

Once the layout is complete, we print the books. Copies are then distributed at no-cost to the narrators and their families. We also maintain digital files of the books and photos from the Veterans to be archived and accessed by researchers in the future.



Veterans have responded enthusiastically to our project. We have a long (and ever-growing) list of individuals eager to participate. We interview Veterans from all branches and and work to maintain a balance of gender and all eras, while prioritizing World War II and Korean War Veterans.

Following the interview, audio is sent to a professional transcriptionist who creates a written transcript. That transcript is then shared with the narrator for any edits or changes they wish to make.

Once the interviews are complete and edits have been made, we begin creation of the book. This includes writing a preface that highlighting the life of the narrator, adding photographs, lightly editing for clarity, adding references if needed, and indexing the narrative for researchers.
