## PROGRAM

Today's program was presented by **Emont Duncan**. He is currently a police officer with the Henderson Police Department and has been a part of <u>Henderson Police Athletic League</u> for approximately 3 years. **Emont** has had a passion for community outreach since a teenager growing up in St. Louis, MO, and was deeply involved in community toy drives, Thanksgiving dinner distributions, community service events and mentoring. He also was given a Resolution with the City of St. Louis for his community work with the youth at the age of 18. **Emont** has had a love for boxing since a young age which helped him deal with emotions and found it to be a great mentoring tool. Now as a police officer, He is able to continue to give back through the Henderson PAL gym by teaching boxing and mentoring weekly.



Emont was also the recipient of this year's SOAR award representing the Henderson police department.

The purpose of the PAL program is to create "champions in the community" by operating a youth boxing program. It is not the intention of this program to prepare youth to become professional boxers. It is their goal to point PAL kids in the direction stated in their Mission Statement..."To mentor and aid our youth with discipline, life skills and fitness, and to bring kids from different backgrounds together and provide a safe place to learn, build relationships and grow. It is their hope that all the youth that choose to participate and benefit from the program become law-abiding and productive citizens who contribute to the community.

He invited everyone to visit their gym located at 820 N. Major St. in Henderson. He said they are open from 2pm to 4pm on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursdays.

When kids come in, he said they sit them down and (1) set a foundation and get a first impression, (2) determine why they are there, (3) determine what the role of the mentor will be, (4) set boundaries, (5) determine accountability, (6) establish consistency expectations, and (7) listen, respond, repeat back.
