Jack Woodcock introduced our Speaker who was none other than our own **Bryan Dziedziak** ("Jay-Jack" for all you new Rotarians!). 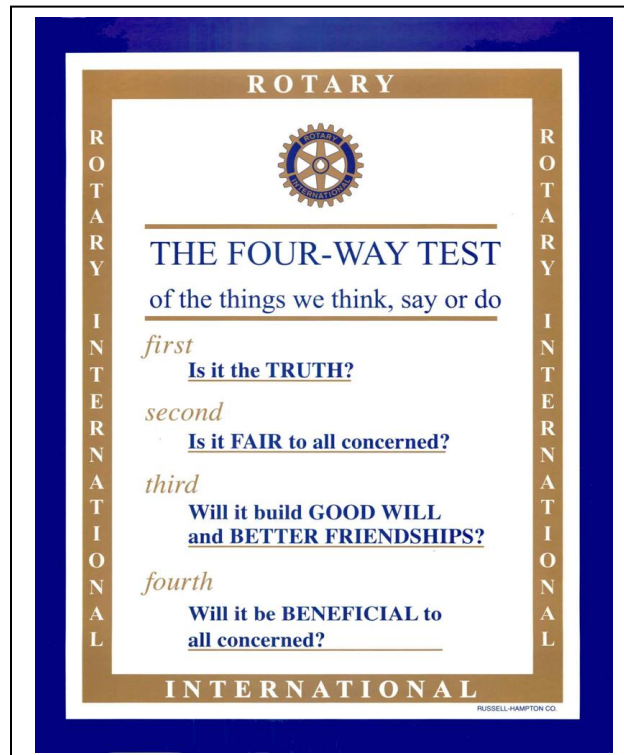

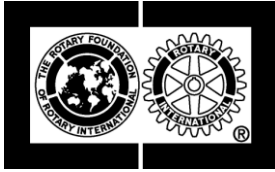

The Rotary Foundation Corner

July 16, 2018

The Mission of The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International is to enable Rotarians to advance World Understanding, Goodwill and Peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

The Objective of The Rotary Foundation is the achievement of World Understanding and Peace through International Charitable and Educational Programs.

PolioPlus and the World Health Organization

As a follow up on our prior Foundation Corner, WHO has a 5 page summary on Poliomyelitis on their website I have printed out. Some of the information I have printed below.

Key Facts

- Polio mainly affects children under 5 years of age.
- 1 in 200 infections leads to irreversible paralysis. Among those paralyzed, 5% to 10% die when their breathing muscles become immobilized.
- Case due to wild poliovirus have decreased more than 99% since 1988, from an estimated 350,000 cases then to just 22 reported cases in 2017. As a result of the global effort to eradicate the disease, more than 16 million people have been saved from paralysis.
- As long as a **SINGLE** child remains infected, children in **ALL** countries are at risk of contracting polio. Failure to eradicate the last remaining strongholds could result in as many as 200,000 new cases every year, within 10 years, over the world.
- In most countries, the global effort has expanded capabilities to tackle other infectious diseases by building effective surveillance and immunization programs.

Examples of this were reported in our Rotarian magazine.

The Rotarian, November 1999: Luis Fremin Tenoria of Peru was only 2 years old when he contracted polio in 1991 ... the last known case in the Western Hemisphere. Adopted by Rotarians in Peru and the US, Luis has received love and attention, physical therapy, language therapy, private tutors, and dental and orthodontia treatment. In return, Luis has written, "My Dad is Rotary, he loves me a lot... I always want to go hand-in-hand with Rotary ... I am going to be good to everyone and I'm going to do my homework. That's why I ask that you never forget me..Rotary." Today, Luis is an 18 year old graduate of vocational training, with dual degrees in Culinary Science - specialty pastry, and shoe design and manufacture. His support for the past 10 years has been guided by Gordon Schable, PDG of District 6620, who in 10 years has raised \$120,000 to support Luis, and has had Luis to the US for two trips, one for 1 week and a second for 2 weeks. Gordon has made 19 trips to Peru since 1995.

On July 13, 2007, a 22 year old Pakistani student arrived in Melbourne, Australia, and was diagnosed with polio, contracted during a visit to Pakistan, one of four polio-endemic countries. (The others are Afghanistan, India and Nigeria.) He was kept in isolation until he was virus free on August 9, 2007. Also in July, 2 cases of polio were discovered in Chad, one of them near the Darfur region of Sudan. A cross-border emergency response was planned, and Rotary's PolioPlus Partners program released \$241,000 for an urgent immunization program in Sudan. Robert Scott, chair of the Rotary Foundations Trustees and the International PolioPlus Committee, said "This case proves that polio in your polio-free country is just a plane ride away. It is essential to continue with the PolioPlus program."

And it is still essential that we continue our efforts!
