

RECOGNITIONS





**Rotary Club of Las Vegas Southwest
Article for District 5300 Highlighter

Eight volunteers from the Rotary Club of Las Vegas Southwest traveled to Puerto Vallarta on 2/18/26 to participate in a joint water filter project with the Rotary Club of Puerto Vallarta Sur and various other clubs from the United States and Canada.

After attending Rotary on Thursday and visiting various Rotary projects, we met for dinner at the home of one of the PV Rotarians. After spending Friday whale watching, we spent Saturday in the little village of Costa Dorada where we assembled and distributed 385 water filters to families from four impoverished colonies.

Sunday morning we arose to the sight of many smoke plumes all over the city. We were told to shelter in our hotels as the criminal cartel was actively burning cars, buses, and many small businesses, but none closer than two blocks away, apparently in retribution for the capture and assassination of the cartel's leader early Sunday morning. Cars and business were burned all around. One of our Rotarians even helped put out a fire at his hotel. About 9:30 that morning we were in the porte cochere of the hotel when a cartel member on a motor bike followed by a small car full of cartel members came speeding down our street and after realizing it was a dead end, sped through the porte cochere the wrong way. As soon as the motor bike came in sight, all the hotel employees, and us, scrambled to find cover. Fortunately they didn't stop and left the way they came. The cartel was apparently not interested in killing people as no tourists or locals were killed or injured.

Fires continued to burn throughout the day but by evening all was calm. Monday morning was quiet with no incidents and the locals were already towing away the burned vehicles and cleaning the streets. By Tuesday morning, you couldn't tell anything had ever happened. Stores and restaurants were open and people were out in the streets as usual.

We returned to Las Vegas on Wednesday with little or no problem getting through the PV airport. All in all, another memorable Rotary project is in the books! Check our website (www.lvswr.org) in the next few days for an album of pictures.



Good afternoon, everyone.

Imagine a shy, bookish boy in Pretoria, South Africa, in the 1970s and '80s—divorced parents, bullying at school, growing up amid the tensions of apartheid. This boy devours science fiction comics and novels, dreams of space battles and saving the world, and at age 12 codes his first video game, selling it for \$500. That boy was Elon Musk.

Today, he's the force behind SpaceX, Tesla, xAI, and much more—pushing humanity toward sustainable energy, multi-planetary life, and AI that benefits all. His impact on the world grows every year.

What fascinates me most isn't the rockets or the cars—it's the journey of his mind. How does a lonely, curious kid transform into someone who bets everything on ideas most call impossible? Let's briefly trace that evolution: from wonder to crisis, from code to conquest, from personal survival to species-level ambition. Here we go.

Elon Reeve Musk was born on June 28, 1971, in Pretoria, South Africa, to engineer father Errol and model/dietician mother Maye. His parents divorced when he was 10, and life wasn't easy. Elon was introverted, often lost in books—science fiction like Isaac Asimov and Douglas Adams shaped him early.

At age 10 or 11, he taught himself programming from a manual. By 12, he created *Blastar*, a space-themed video game he sold to a magazine. He later said, "Maybe I read too many comics as a kid. In the comics, it always seems like they are trying to save the world. It seemed like one should try to make the world a better place because the inverse makes no sense."

Around age 14, Elon hit an existential crisis: What's the meaning of life? Why are we here? He dove into philosophy, religion, and sci-fi.

He found clarity in Douglas Adams' **The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy**: the hardest part was figuring out the right questions. From there, he concluded we should "aspire to increase the scope and scale of human consciousness in order to better understand what questions to ask."

His teenage mission statement: "The only thing that makes sense to do is strive for greater collective enlightenment."

This marked a huge shift—from passive wonder to active purpose. No longer just dreaming about space; he saw humanity's fate as his responsibility. Life on one fragile planet? Risky.

His thinking evolved from "What if?" to "We must."

His thinking was already big-picture: curiosity about technology, space, and human potential. But South Africa in the '80s was violent and divided. Elon faced brutal bullying at school—once hospitalized after being thrown down the stairs—and he had a strained relationship with his father. At 17, he left for Canada (via his mother's citizenship) to avoid mandatory military service and to chase bigger opportunities. He worked odd jobs—cleaning boilers, cutting logs—while studying at Queen's University, then transferring to the University of Pennsylvania for degrees in physics and economics.

Here, the curious kid met the real world: physics for understanding fundamentals, economics for building things that scale. But he wasn't just learning—he was already thinking about impact.

After Penn, Elon briefly started a PhD at Stanford but dropped out after two days to chase the internet boom. In 1995, with brother Kimbal, he founded Zip2—an online city guide—sold to Compaq for ~\$300 million in 1999 (Elon netted ~\$22 million).

Then starting X.com (online banking), which merged into PayPal.

eBay bought it in 2002 for \$1.5 billion; Elon walked away with ~\$165 million.

These weren't just money-makers for Elon. PayPal proved internet could transform finance. His thinking shifted: technology scales solutions. **First principles** (boil things to fundamentals, reason up) inspired by physics became his framework.

He could've retired. Instead, **he bet it all** on two "impossible" ideas.

In 2002, Elon founded SpaceX to make humans multi-planetary—because "if something bad happens on Earth, it's game over." Early failures (three rocket explosions) nearly bankrupted him. But in 2008 the fourth and last rocket launch succeeded gaining SpaceX a NASA contract that saved it.

At the same time his investments in Tesla propelled him to become the CEO that same year. Tesla wasn't his idea, but he saw electric cars + batteries as key to sustainable energy. Both companies faced near-death moments—2008 financial crisis almost killed them but the funds from SpaceX held them on by a thread.

Today SpaceX has merged with the AI company XAI to become a multi trillion dollar company with over 14,000 Starlink satellites orbiting the Earth providing excellent internet access to over 10million subscribers. Their plans are to build data centers on Earth, in space, and within 5 years on the moon. The

data centers will provide the intelligence to operate the millions of autonomous cars and Optimus robots that will be manufactured by Tesla over the next 5 years. These robots will be working on the moon and will be the initial work crew to inhabit Mars within 20 years.

His philosophy through the years has deepened: embrace risk, work insanely hard, question everything. He said, "When something is important enough, you do it even if the odds are not in your favor." From PayPal's digital disruption to SpaceX/Tesla's physical-world transformation, his thinking evolved from software to hardware, from profit to existential survival.

As Elon's dream of creating a world with sustainable energy and becoming multi planetary with a city on Mars he has formed multiple companies such as SolarCity (renewables that will provide the power to operate the data centers in space and on the moon), Neuralink (brain interfaces to help people with spinal cord problems, hearing, vision etc.), The Boring Company building 68 miles of tunnels in our Las Vegas and eventually on the moon, xAI and the multiple Data Centers (for understanding the universe), even buying Twitter (now X) to guarantee free speech—stem from expanding consciousness and ensuring humanity's future.

I would like to focus on what is happening very fast right now and that is the Autonomous Vehicle market.

The Tesla vehicle is a technology marvel. I believe strongly that the EV market will dominate the future and Tesla along with Rivian, Lucid, and several other major manufacturers will dominate. But my research has shown that Tesla is years ahead. I hope you will give it a try when you make your next vehicle purchase.

The Tesla of today virtually drives itself. Available on every Tesla today's what is called FSD supervised. This allows you to put a destination on your car sitting in your driveway and touch the screen in the car and without touching the steering wheel or the pedals the car will deliver you to the destination and park in the parking lot or driveway. I have done that countless times with little problems. And I have to tell you that I love it.

Here's a fun thing that Tesla did. They have the xAI interface called Grok that by pushing a button you can ask any questions that you like. It also interacts with the FSD. So let's say that you are going to see your grandmother across town and you think that it might be nice to bring flowers and a bottle of wine. You ask Grok if there is a flower shop somewhere along the route. It replies with several options, you select one and then ask it to stop there along the way. It updates your driving itinerary. Then you ask if there is a place to buy wine along the way. It gives you options of the grocery store, Total Wine, Lee's etc. and you select it and it adds it to your trip. Then you might ask it about Thai restaurants to go to after you see grandma etc. etc. You get the point.

It drives safely and carefully. There are multiple modes you can set your car to that will give you less or more aggressive driving.

It will pass slower cars, maneuver around potholes and puddles and items in the road.


It will look out for animals, people in crosswalks, it will pull over for emergency vehicles, stop for construction signs, avoids construction cones, recognizes hand signals, will pull over if tail-gated, will stop at toll booths and gate guards, and literally thousands more maneuvers that will amaze you.



What does this mean for the safety of driving? 43,000 people die every year in car accidents. 30% are caused by inattentive driving. You've seen the people focusing on their phones rather than the road. 20% are caused by drivers under the influence. The goal of Tesla is to make the vehicle 10x more safe than the average driver and continue to improve. Today it is not perfect but they are working on it 24/7.

The Tesla vehicle of tomorrow will drive itself and be available like an Uber at very reasonable rates per mile or you can have your own car be autonomous. Why own multiple cars when you can send your car off to pick up the kids and deliver them home, then take kids to sports practice, your spouse to the doctor or appointments, and pick you up after work. Families could share vehicles among households. Condominiums could have a small fleet to take care of the people residing there, charging a small fee per mile. Your own car could drive you to the airport then go park back home. Then come pick you up when you fly back.


I encourage you to look into autonomous driving for yourself and your family. It is the way of the future.
